NESHANNOCK TOWNSHIP AWARDED GRANT TO IMPROVE ROADS, SPUR
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Neshannock Township, Lawrence County, PA (March 27, 2024) – Neshannock Township will receive nearly \$1.3 million for infrastructure improvements to King’s Chapel and Pulaski Roads. Awarded through the state’s Multimodal Transportation Fund Program, grant funds will be used to alleviate flooding along Kings Chapel Road and improve traffic conditions at the Pulaski Road/Rt. 422 interchange.

“These traffic and road safety improvements will benefit all Neshannock residents, but are also essential for the ongoing development of Millennium Park,” Township Supervisor Leslie Bucci said. Earlier this year, Steelite International, a warehouse and distribution center located in Neshannock’s Millennium Park, announced a major expansion.

“Our Township worked hard to support Steelite, and we’re grateful for their ongoing commitment to this region. These improvements will help accommodate increased traffic, and promote additional development by improving access to Millennium,” Bucci said.

Bucci said Sen. Michele Brooks and Rep. Marla Brown were instrumental in helping the Township secure this funding.
